## The Seven Eyed Supervision Model

### Workshop content, aims & who should attend

This workshop is aimed at anyone who would like to develop a real understanding of The Seven Eyed Model of Supervision. Such an understanding is important whether you are a supervisor or a supervisee as it will enable you to think more clearly about the many factors that contribute to all sorts of supervision. Although the book “Supervision in the Helping Professions” (Hawkins and Shoet 2012) offers a good overview of the model, and has been translated into eight languages and has been the foundation for supervisor training all over the world, a much richer understanding will be derived through direct communicate with the author.

To facilitate this understanding, the day will take an experiential position. After giving an overview of the model, there will be opportunities to practice in the larger group and also in groups of three or four. There will be a particular focus on the choice of mode on any one time - what options there were and why a particular one was chosen? This will help delegates understand more about their own particular style and to receive feedback.

### Facilitator

Robin Shoet has been a supervisor for over thirty five years. He is co-author (with Peter Hawkins) of Supervision in the Helping Professions (Open University Press) and editor of Passionate Supervision, (Jessica Kingsley Publishers) and Supervision as Transformation (Jessica Kingsley Publishers). His latest book, Clinical Supervision in the Medical Profession is co-edited with Dr David Owen. He has been using Appreciative Inquiry with teams and organisations for the last ten years, and is currently writing about the spiritual dimension of supervision. He is also co-founder of the Centre for Supervision and Team Development. He particularly enjoys group supervision and working with teams.
