

FOI 0246/2022 Response

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act (2000) to request information relating to the provision of ADHD (Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder) services by Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health NHS Foundation Trust.

Please provide equivalent answers for Questions 1-6, but for Adult ADHD services in the Trust. If the Trust does not distinguish between CYP and Adult ADHD services, please answer Questions 1-6 for all patients collectively

Please provide the following information:

1. Please name the organisation(s) that deliver(s) CYP (children and young people) ADHD assessment / diagnoses in your Trust area.

Child Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS):

The Trust is unable to provide a response in relation to Children and Young People services.

This is because the Trust is not commissioned and therefore does not provide ADHD services for CYP and we recommend that you redirect your request to Birmingham Women's and Children's Trust.

Adult services:

Birmingham and Solihull Mental Health Foundation Trust (BSMHFT) deliver an assessment and diagnosis service.

Child Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS):
