# Q1 The number of people who have been or are currently being treated for a personality disorder

Treatment defined by requester as any intervention provided to someone with PD. BSMHFT consider diagnoses recorded against a referral as the conditions relevant to the individual's treatment during the course of that referral. As such, we have provided numbers of people with an open referral in the period with a PD diagnosis recorded against that referral However, please note that these numbers should be treated with caution because:

a) There may be some under-counting both due to missing diagnostic information and due to a reluctance to assign the PD label to service users;

*b*)That some of the people included may during any given period be receiving treatment primarily for other mental health conditions and not necessarily for their personality disorder

#### Q2 How many have received therapy

Following clarification from the requester we have restricted these numbers to Dialectical Behaviour Therapy (DBT) as the therapy identified in NICE guidelines as appropriate specifically for treating personality disorders However, many people in this cohort will have engaged in other therapies assessed as being appropriate to their needs

Numbers provided for this question include anyone in the cohort in Question 1 who either had an activity of DBT scheduled or had an open referral with the DBT clinical team in the period.
