The Trust provides the following CAMHS services:

-Solar provided by the Trust in conjunction with , Barnardo's and Autism West Midlands to provide emotional wellbeing and mental health services for children and young people in Solihull within our Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service.

We provide multi-disciplinary assessment and treatment of children and young people with mental health or severe emotional and behavioural difficulties. The service currently accepts children and young people, until their 19th birthday, who are residents in the borough of Solihull, go to school or college in the Solihull area, or have a Solihull GP.

-Children & Young People's Division CAMHS services for Child and young people who are struggling with their mental health for those residing in the Birmingham area.

However, please note that the management of Children & Young People's services for Birmingham was transferred from Forward Thinking Birmingham Service (hosted Birmingham Women's and Children's Trust) to BSMHFT from 1st July 2025.
